Triangular trade in crustaceans from GB

To: VIs at Border Control Posts and SVIs with BCPs in their area

Please see: INFO NOTE (17/05/2022) attached.

The United Kingdom have not presented a residue-monitoring plan (RMP) for crustaceans, but intend to export crustaceans to the EU, which have been originally sourced from an EU Member State or from a third country with an approved RMP.

The United Kingdom has provided sufficient guarantees that the requirements laid down in Article 2 of Decision 2011/163 are complied with. These guarantees will permit triangular trade in crustaceans from the UK.

In light of the above clarifications and pending the upcoming adoption and publication of the two draft acts – CID (SANTE 10254/2022) amending Decision 2011/163/EU and CIR (SANTE 10256/2022) amending Annexes to Implementing Regulation (EU) 2021/405 the Commission has asked member states to adopt a pragmatic approach to allow trade to continue for imports of consignments of crustacean products coming from the UK through triangular trade.

When the Regulations are published a more detailed circular will issue on this trade. In the meantime, the importation of consignments of crustaceans that meet the EU import requirements can be accepted from the UK.
